

- ANSWER...Can I use a different date format on the Form I-9? If a different format has been used should I correct the Form I-9? It is recommended to use the American date format MM/DD/YYYY which is shown on the Form I-9 and the Form I-9 Instructions. Other formats are acceptable as long as it is clear what format was used. Corrections are not required to correct the date format.
